Start your New Year with a Wellness Check and prioritize your health!



Ask your career counselor about the Baptist Health Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Training program available at your career center. This free class is offered through self-directed and in-person learning. Baptist Health will cover the cost of the course, provide books and other learning materials to help you be successful, and pay for the required national background check.

After completing the program, you will be able to take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) exam. You will be responsible for the \$104 testing fee. Once you pass the exam, you can apply for EMT jobs with an agency of your choosing.

Class size is limited; contact your career center for an application.

Important program dates:

- Applications due Dec. 20, 2025. Ask your career counselor for an application.
- Class begins Jan. 20, 2026.
- Classes are Tuesday and Thursday from 1:30-4:30 p.m. Virtual attendance is expected at each class, with a few in-person classes held at your local career center.
- Class ends May 14, 2026, but may be completed earlier depending on class progress.

Program requirements:

- At least 18 years of age.
- · Possess a high school diploma/GED.
- Pass a national background check with no record of felony convictions. You will not be permitted to take the NREMT exam with a felony conviction.
- Possess an active driver's license or the ability to obtain one.
- Meet the general EMT skills and abilities, as outlined by your career counselor.
